- To improve human resources through education, vocational & managerial skill development training programs.



**PROGRESS DURING THE YEAR**

**(I) BIHAR SKILL DEVELOPMENT MISSION (KUSHAL YUVA PROGRAM)**

Kushal Yuva Program (KYP) is a flagship skill development program launched by the Government of Bihar in 2016. The main objective of this program is to provide skill development and employment opportunities to the youth of Bihar, particularly those who have dropped out of school or college. Under this program, eligible candidates are provided with free-of-cost skill development training in various sectors such as retail, hospitality, healthcare, construction, and information technology.

The KYP program also aims to create a workforce equipped with the necessary skills and knowledge to meet the demands of the industry and contribute to the state's economy. The program is implemented by the Bihar Skill Development Mission (BSDM), which is responsible for identifying and partnering with training providers to offer training programs that are aligned with industry requirements. Upon completion of the training, candidates are assisted in finding employment opportunities through job fairs and placement drives conducted by BSDM.

**Activities Details in 2023-2024 under KYP**

**(1.1) Base Line Survey at Micro Level:** Baseline surveys were conducted at 72 villages of Phulwarisharif, Punpun, and Sampatchak blocks of Patna district. People were made aware about the KYP. The survey details are as under:

**(1.2) Home Visit:** Home visits are crucial aspects of KYP as it help to minimize the chances of the dropout and absence of the enrolled students from training. Home visits of such 116 students were done and they were encouraged to attend their classes regularly. On the occasion, the parents and students were told about the importance of the program.

**(1.3) Free Training Course:** In 2023-24, at Mahuli (Centre Code: KYP 06040053), a total of 431 students were enrolled and trained for a 120 hour computer training course in KYP with an initiative to make students computer literate and generate employability. The students were taught about smart use of IT literacy skills like Windows 7, internet browsing, MS Word, MS Excel, MS Power Point, Google Apps, Open office writers, MS Outlooks etc. and made them proficient in computer operation. Experienced project personnel like PC, computer teachers, and field staff were recruited to make KYP a success.



**(1.4) Prize Distribution Ceremony:** A prize distribution ceremony was organized by SKSM for the KYP students who participated in the different activities like essay writing cum painting competition, presentation on the relevance of computers in daily life, and project work competitions. Prizes like trophies, books, pens, and other materials were distributed among the KYP students who came first, second, and third position in the discussion. Details are as under:

**(1.5) Organization of village meetings:** To bring sanitization and build a positive environment for KYP, meetings at the village, panchayat, and village levels were organized by SKSM with village youth, PRI representatives, and people of the local community. These meetings helped in making the participants informed about the objectives and importance of KYP and other youth-oriented programs of Bihar and central governments. The participants were informed that the Bihar Skill Development Mission (BSDM) has been constituted by the Government of Bihar to empower the youth by providing them with requisite skills to fuel the growth of the State of Bihar.

In these meetings, the youth were motivated to join KYP for their bright future, and PRIs and communities were urged to come forward and build a positive environment at homes and society so that youth may become skilled and become employed. The details of the meetings are as under:

**(1.6) Distribution of Facilitation Materials:** To motivate studying KYP students towards training, SKSM distributed facilitation materials like raincoats, umbrellas, shoes, and bags to them.

**(1.7) Meetings with the Personnel of Educational Institutions:** To spread knowhow of the KYP among the masses, SKSM contacted teachers of educational institutions such as high school teachers, private coaching institutes, and commercial institutes in Phulwarisharif, Sampatchak, and Punpun blocks in Patna district and gave them complete information related to the operation of KYP. In 2023-24, 16 such meetings were organized successfully. Details are as under:

### **OVERALL PROGRAM ACHIEVEMENTS**

- 431 students were imparted quality computer training under KYP. Poor students of poor and disadvantaged communities were given preference during admission.
- Result:** 431 students passed 72 SHA and 32 student credit card beneficiaries.
- Out of 431 students who passed, 70% students have been successfully placed for employment/self-employment after training.
- Basic computer literacy has increased the employability potential of youth.
- Helped in the smooth shift from homes to places of youth with high employment potential with increased retention at the workplace.
- Local communities, ASHA, and Anganwadi Sevika enhanced capacities helped in the successful implementation of the project.
- GPs were made aware of children's issues and worked collectively to solve them.

### **(II) JEEVAN JYOTI PROGRAM**

Bihar is home to over 1.75 million blind individuals, making it one of the most blindness-affected states in India. The majority of these cases are due to cataracts-a condition that is easily treatable but remains unchecked due to lack of access to affordable eye care. The

situation is even direr in rural areas of Bihar, where over 85% of the population lives with limited or no access to specialized eye services.

Imagine a world of darkness, where simple tasks like reading, working, or seeing loved ones become impossible. This is the reality for millions in Bihar who live in the shadows of preventable blindness. The economic and social impact is devastating, not just for individuals, but for entire families who become trapped in a cycle of poverty and dependency.

In such a situation, there is need to work with sincerity and dedication to cure blindness in Bihar. With the support of Ahilya Devi Eye Hospital (Siwan), SKSM initiated Jeevan Jyoti Program. The program is being implemented in Saran and Siwan districts in Bihar. District wise coverage details of the program are as under:
